Are you going to help combat gentrification?	Yes- Haverhill's diversity is one of the reasons we love living here. We need to have systems and support in place to keep people in their homes, and to maintain a meaningful balance of housing for all income levels.	As we see today, rising rents, interest rates, and lower inventory, is affecting wider ranges of classes. We must recognize that in order to help improve our housing crisis, we must be sure to take into account the future workforce and needs of our growing city, and to create a community around those enrichment opportunities.
Do you have a plan to combat rising costs of housing?	Maybe- I would like to see the City implement some of the methods being used in Boston and other cities to slow the rising costs of housing, specifically, limiting the percent rents can increase from year to year.	We must advocate for better and more affordable housing options for all residents and ensure that tax burdens on property owners are not subjugated to households of certain socioeconomic class.
Do you have plans to improve DPW and the trash issue in the city?	Yes- DPW is understaffed and under- resourced. The city's future budgets should reflect increased staffing costs.	While I'm uncertain about specific issues concerning the DPW and trash, I will say that the DPW provides an essential service to our city. It's important that we ensure it is operating at its best ability and capacity and ready to meet any future challenges.
Do you have plans to implement needle drop off boxes?	Yes- I volunteered with the RI Needle Exchange Program while I was in college-needle drop boxes are necessary.	I do not have specific plans for this, but I love the idea! We must ensure those struggling with addiction are provided with safe measures to prevent illness and overdose.
Do you have any solutions to address the addiction crisis in our community?	Yes- I want to help end the stigma around the use of Narcan to assist those overdosing, and make sure that more members of our community are trained in administering it.	Haverhill is home to a couple detox and addiction services, but not all accept MassHealth. We must help attract more healthcare options for all those struggling with addiction, particularly those with MassHealth.
Will you prioritize the safety of our kids and families in public spaces such as parks?	Yes	Yes- Our parks are available to all of our citizens for the recreation and enjoyment of community and nature. We MUST ensure that our residents feel safe and comfortable to enjoy the many outdoor activities our city has to offer.

Yes- We actually thought about hosting a fridge outside of the UU Church on Ashland St. I'd love to see a community fridge or more little free food pantries in Haverhill.	I am unfamiliar with Lawrence's community fridge, but I love the idea! I would certainly enjoy learning more about this and how we may be able to implement this in Haverhill.
Do you have any plans to combat the mental health crisis?	Yes- Connecting agencies with each other to provide more immediate help. More social workers/mental health specialists involved with police calls; increased spending to address mental health needs of our school aged students.	Unfortunately, the mental health crisis is a far bigger issue that goes beyond the abilities of the Haverhill City Council. This is an issue that must be addressed at the state and/or federal level.
Do you have plans to improve our school systems and make them more safe?	Yes- The city needs to commit to regularly increasing its share of funding for our schools, instead of relying on one time infusions of money.	It is imperative that all of our schools have well established security measures and technology. As councilor, I hope to develop a strong and positive relationship with the newly elected school committee, school administrators, and parents to explore ways to address the issues and concerns of our education system.
Do you have a plan to address the violence in our community?	Maybe- Build trust and partnerships with respected community members. Listen to our neighbors and peers, learn how we can change violent behaviors.	It's important that the city council have a strong and positive relationship with the school committee, police department, and community organizations, to tackle the issues of violence.We need a multifaceted approach and develop strong relationships within the community.
