Question	Celina Reyes
Are you going to address and help with the homelessness issue in the city?	Yes- I've worked very close with coordinators of homelessness programs, to find out different programs to better combat homelessness. I am also working with the mayor and having multiple conversations in hopes of getting funding allocated to these programs, to better fit the different types of homelessness.
Are you going to help combat gentrification?	Yes- I am very open to having conversations about this, because I do want more opportunities to be created, but we do not want rent for those who live in the area to get out of control. I have been a part of many conversations about this, and hope a consensus can be come to.
Do you have a plan to combat rising costs of housing?	Yes- I've had many conversations with community members about this, and have brought this us to lawyers and representatives, in hope of making housing affordable to all.
Do you have plans to improve DPW and the trash issue in the city?	Yes- During my time, we've had many conversations, meetings about the city's cleanliness, and have worked with/ further support DPW and better take care of the city.
Do you have plans to implement needle drop off boxes?	Yes- Here in the city, we're usually referred to a certain department for needle drop boxes, but we are hoping to locate strategic locations for these boxes set ups.
Do you have any solutions to address the addiction crisis in our community?	Yes- We've been working with the department of health to see which additional programs we can implement in our city to aid this issue. This is a large and constantly evolving crisis, and we are continuing to work in aims for its solutions.
Will you prioritize the safety of our kids and families in public spaces such as parks?	Yes- I've been a part of the remodels of many parks, as well as its vigilance. We've implemented rules to better the safety as well as increase patrols around them.

Do you have a plan to address food insecurity?	Yes- I've worked in different organizations since the pandemic to help distribute food and nutritional products to families at home, as well as had conversations with our senator and representatives in hopes of bringing better solutions for people and families who need aid in nutrition
Lawrence has a community fridge that can be used by the food insecure, will you implement anything similar or new to this in your community?	Yes- We have different organizations who do food distribution, and recognize that it is still a large issue. We have identified that it is a need to implement these types of programs and it is a constant conversation.
Do you have any plans to combat the mental health crisis?	Absolutely, I know that it is a health crisis highly effecting all ages, and I've brought to the attention of representatives and senators that mental health resources are often not covered by insurance. This is a conversation that needs a lot of attention, and we will continue to strive for its solution.
Do you have plans to improve our school systems and make them more safe?	Yes- I have always thought that our public schools should have programs like the vocational schools to help our students learn new skills for their futures and careers. I also believe that we need more security and public safety in schools. I have aided in implementing more secure features like cameras and more security staff.
Do you have a plan to address the violence in our community?	Yes- I am in constant communication with the chief of police as well as the officers in charge of different districts in our city.
Will you listen to youth voices in your position?	Yes- I always welcome youth to my meetings, office, and have worked with youth apart of different schools and sports, in order to listen to what they believe our city's next steps should be, as they are the future of our city.

There must be something in place to assist with tackling the crisis. I'd like to know who the key players are, and would want to know how we can enhance what already exists. Furthermore, the solutions must be both immediate impacting and long-term focused.
